- 44 % upper secondary education
- 45 % tertiary education








Finnish education system




English-taught degree programmes

- Universities: 10 Bachelor's degree programmes and over 100 Master's degree programmes, and English-taught doctoral degree options.


Degree students from and to Finland 2009–2018: Higher education

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INTERNATIONAL MOBILITY PERIODS OF HIGHER EDUCATION STUDENTS FROM AND TO FINLAND 2015-2020






Internationalisation of Finnish Higher Education


